

Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (S-CAP)

- April 2023 March 2028.
- Canada-Alberta investment of \$508 million over 5-years for Strategic Initiatives.
- Provides Business Risk Management (BRM) and Strategic Initiative policy direction.
- Outlines the vision, guiding principles, and <u>five</u> priority areas.
- Flexibility to meet provincial needs while supporting shared national outcomes.





Sustainable CAP Features

- Fundamentals of CAP maintained.
 - Shared vision, regional flexibility, 60:40 cost-sharing, results reporting.
- Increased focus.
 - Environment and climate change with link to Business Risk Management programs.
 - Participation of underrepresented individuals and groups.
 - Performance measurement and results reporting.
- New Resilient Agricultural Landscape Program (RALP).
- Funding Increase of 25 per cent for Strategic Initiatives.
- Changes to BRM programs.
 - More timely, equitable and easy to understand.
 - Better protect producers against climate risk going forward.

Economic Development in Rural Alberta Plan (EDRAP)

To support rural growth and economic progress by integrating rural perspectives into new and existing Government of Alberta policies, strategies and programs.



Plan Overview

- Engagement was conducted in 2021 & 2022
- Designed as a five-year plan with five strategic directions:
 - 1: Economic Development Enabling Infrastructure
 - 2: Rural Business Supports and Entrepreneurship
 - 3: Support for Labour Force and Skills Development
 - 4: Marketing and Promoting Rural Tourism
 - 5: Rural Economic Development Capacity Building
- In 2028, a final impact report will be compiled.



Available Supports

• \$195,000 provided to Alberta Women Entrepreneurs to expand the NextStep to Success program that supports Indigenous women entrepreneurs.

• \$4.6 million in new funding in Budget 2023 to implement the Economic Development in Rural Alberta Plan with grant proposal intake opening fall/winter 2023.
